Dyslexia

Things you need to know

Dyslexia friendly classrooms are great for all pupils.

Dyslexia is often associated with finding reading and spelling difficult. It can also affect processing and organisation. It has no impact on a student's ability.

Dyslexia is a 'specific learning difficulty' SPLD.

Students with a standardised score below 85 in reading or spelling will be allowed a reader or a scribe in their exams. This will only be allowed if it is their 'normal way of working' in the classroom.

Many dyslexic learners are sociable, verbally able, have a good general knowledge and can be interested in current affairs.

Support you can offer students

- Use cream paper for printed resources
- Avoid black fonts on white backgrounds
- Use blue board pens
- ➤ Allow additional time to complete tasks
- Give thinking time
- Say "Hands down I'll choose"
- Minimise copying
- Provide photocopies of power points
- > Print out homework with a due date
- Allow students to record work in different ways e.g. mindmaps, storyboards, flow charts, scribed work, video, oral presentations, diagrams
- Differentiate tasks e.g. must, should, could
- Provide opportunities for peer tutoring
- Provide opportunities for paired reading
- Allow scribed work when appropriate
- Allow the right to pass
- Invite all pupils to read out loud
- Visually teach spellings
